Where can you walk down the street and find--among other things--everything from an all day folk music stage to pony rides for the kids, an antique and classic car show, a craft fair, a beer garden, good food, and (we hope) beautiful weather? Try the Heritage Festival in downtown Downers Grove on June 22, 23 and 24. (All day folk stage on the 23 only.)

For folk music, start out on Friday night, the 22nd, around eight o'clock, and look for the bluegrass band Special Consensus out in front of the Two Way Street Coffee House, 1047 Curtiss. Also appearing will be Bedlam, a traditional music group. Then come back for more music and fun on the folk stage in Fishel Park, behind the coffee house. From 10 to 6 you'll hear continuous music--traditional folk tunes, old time country and more from some of your favorite Plank Road and Two Way Street performers, including: Thursday's Child, Mark Dvorak, Marianne Mohrhusen, The Jones Family, Roscoe Champ & Ron Simpson, Lee Murdock, Michael Miles, Bryan Dagenhart and others. And don't forget to try out the eats from local restaurants and check out the information booths set up by area non-profit groups. There will also be other entertainment stages on all three days of the festival.

The Heritage Festival began as a small one day street fair held on July 4th in celebration of Downers Grove's 150th anniversary. But, in the words of Dave Humphreys, member of the Heritage Festival village commission, it was so much fun they did it again the next year...and the next, and the next. This will be the ninth annual Heritage Festival, and planning it is now the year round job of the committee, which meets at least once a month both on and off season. Each year the festival has grown, and among the attractions that have been added is the folk stage in Fishel Park, which is part of the celebration for the 7th year in a row. So bring your kids, and get set for a great day of relaxation, good food, music, and sun.



The way the weather's been this year I wouldn't be surprised to wake up tomorrow morning and see snow on the ground. But after what seems like 9 months of winter, and wondering whether there's really any good reason not to move to Arizona, I think it's finally time to smooth on the sunscreen and brace ourselves for cicadas and high electric bills.

One of the best parts of this season is the great outdoors, cicadas and all, and for that there's always the beach, the front porch, the local pool and scores of outdoor music festivals. But since there are times we want to get out of the heat, and since most of us can't afford to run our air conditioning day in and day out (despite those wonderful Com Ed commercials we see on T.V.), I thought I'd take a few minutes to share some of my favorite, fairly inexpensive, ways to keep cool this summer.

Movie theaters: The second run theaters are all under \$2 and usually have larger screens and sometimes more comfortable seats than the expensive shows. The Tivoli in Downers Grove is recently renovated, and besides being beautiful it has four-star popcorn. If there's nothing at the "cheap" shows watch for matinee specials at the first-run theaters. Some of the them also have "\$3 Tuesdays."


Shopping: A lot of malls in this area, indoor and out, are beautifully landscaped, and window-shopping doesn't cost anything, although I suggest leaving the credit cards at home. Bookstores, record stores, and gift shops are great places to browse, or just sit on a bench and soak up the cool air. Another idea—after a hot day in the sun, stop by the grocery store and pick up some chilled pop or your favorite ice cream. I recommend Dean's Foods vanilla ice cream cups. They come with little wooden spoons that interact with the taste of the ice cream to instantly transport you back to childhood.

Restaurants: One way go out to eat often on a low budget is to eat dinner at home and then go out for coffee--if you can drink it in the heat--soda, dessert, or a fresh salad. If go after the dinner rush you won't even have to wait for a table, and you can usually linger as long as you like and enjoy the air conditioning and conversation.

Libraries: Besides stocking books on all subjects and for all reading levels, many libraries now also loan albums, audio cassettes of books, and videotapes which include everything from Channel 11 programs to motion pictures, children's shows, and exercise videos. Check bulletin boards for children's story hours and classes or discussion groups for adults, as well as other community events.

And if none of these suggestions appeals to you at the moment, you can always pull out your banjo and cool off with Paul Klonowski's arrangement of "Frosty Morn" on the next page. (Thanks Paul) Have a great summer!
