Lou & Peter Berryman featured at Plank Road in November!

Lou & Peter Berryman *In Concert*, Saturday, November 8 at 8:00 PM at the Two Way Street Coffee House, 1047 Curtiss St., Downers Grove.

This fall, we welcome Lou & Peter Berryman back to the Plank Road stage. Lou & Peter's sophisticated and wickedly funny original songwriting blends the best melodic and lyric aspects of musical comedy, cabaret, and folk music, into a unique syle that has delighted nationwide audiences for nearly 20 years. Their whimsical and wonderfully accessible performance of these songs leaves audiences with cheeks aching from smiling, and with a fresh

perspective on the human condition.

The 10# Fiddle in Lansing says, "Their songs and performances are unfailingly wacky, and just as dependably 100% right. No one writes songs like Lou and Peter, but everyone recognizes the truth and clear vision behind each one". The Folklore society of Greater Washington calls them "Folkdom's favorite funny folks..." and Grassroots Concerts says "Peter and Lou Berryman just have to be the funnybones of the Midwest". Lou and Peter have been friends since 1963 when they met in an art class and then began their musical partnership in the first of a long series of musical groups. They played lots of different kinds of music; folk, jug band and old-time music, with occasional forays into blues and even rock and roll, which have all been adapted to a growing repertoire of original songs. The musical duo as it exists today was formed about 1975. Since then they have performed in big and little venues across the continent, performing only their original songs. The music reflects the wide variety of interests and experiences of these two, as seen through the softening lens of humor.

With influences as diverse as Gilbert and Sullivan and Edith Pilaf, but always with a twist of their own, Lou & Peter Berryman bring an inventive and intelligent humor to the rich melodic legacy of theatrical music. They are in the process of creating their third songbook, and recently they released their tenth recording of original songs to rave reviews. Berryman songs are being sung around the world, by a legion of professional musicians as well as shower singers everywhere, but no one sings them as well as Lou and Peter themselves. Be sure to join

Steve Gillette And Cindy Mangsen House Concert

A House Concert with Steve Gillette and Cindy Mangsen, Saturday, November 15 at 8:00 PM at the Jones Family Music Studio in Lombard. Call 630/916-1356 for reservations.

Performing on guitars, concertina, banjo, and fiddle, Steve and Cindy combine dynamic harmonies, beautiful songs, and instrumental virtuosity to captivate audiences of all ages.

Steve Gillette's musical style reflects his roots in traditional music and the singer/songwriter movement of the mid-sixties. He plays guitar with a unique style using a flat-pick and two fingers with a virtuosity that has been compared to Doc Watson. However, Steve is best known as a superb songwriter. His songs have been recorded by dozens of major artists including Garth Brooks, John Denver, Ian & Sylvia, Waylon Jennings, Anne Murray, Kenny Rogers, Linda Ronstadt, and Tammy Wynette. Steve has performed on over 100 college campuses and at most of the major music festivals. His recent solo album, THE WAYS OF THE WORLD, was recorded in Nashville and produced by Jim Rooney. He is also author of the book, SONGWRITING AND THE CREATIVE PROCESS, published by Sing Out Press.

Cindy Mangsen has long been a favorite of fans who favor traditional material, although her repertoire includes songs of contemporary writers and original songs as well. Cindy plays guitar, concertina, and banjo, and is renowned for her compelling voice, described by one critic as a voice that can warm a New England winter. Her latest solo album, SONGLINES, was chosen one of the top ten folk albums of 1993 by the Boston Globe. She is also well known as a member of a trio with Priscilla Herdman and Anne Hills (as heard on their Flying Fish recording VOICES), and for her duet album with Anne, NEVER GROW OLD. Cindy has been featured at many major US and Canadian folk festivals as well as on National Public Radio's All Things Considered and Mountain Stage.

Together since 1989, this husband and wife team "express a deep affection for traditional and contemporary folk music...Whether the song be a 500 year old ballad, an early blues, or an original composition, Gillette and Mangsen combine respect and intuition for a captivating performance" (Sing Out Magazine). Steve and Cindy have delighted audiences across the United States and Europe with their wonderful music, their humor, and their warm presence. They have recorded two duet albums: LIVE IN CONCERT, which captures their magic on stage, and THE LIGHT OF DAY, which was named Best Folk Album of 1996 by The Midnight Special (WFMT, Chicago) and Folks Like Us, (WDET, Detroit).
