Plank Road Summer Picnic






Campsites may be reserved from May I—October 31. Reservations are accepted by mail starting Jan.2. Walk-in reservations are accepted starting Feb.1. White Pines has class B/S campsites. Class B/S camping means vehicle access and flush toilets/showers are available. Sites 1-16 and 18-33 are available for reservations in the Cedar Ridge Campgrounds. Sites 16 and 18 can only be reserved by persons with a class 2/2A disability as defined in the IL. Identification Card Act.

Send the completed and signed application directly to the park office with your \$5.00 non refundable reservation fee PLUS the appropriate first nights camping fee. See chart on the website or call 815-946-3717 to determine the amount you will need to send. Make the check or money order payable to IL Dept. of Natural Resources—White Pines State Park. The reservation is not final until you have received a letter of confirmation from the park.

- A separate application must be submitted for each campsite or period of time desired. Each application must be in the per sons name and address that will be occupying the campsite and purchasing the camping permit.
- 2. Only one camp shelter per site is allowed (maximum 4 adults or one family consisting of father and/or mother and unmarried minor children; a family may use an additional tent for the minor children.
- 3. Applications and checks must be received in the park office at least 10 days prior to the beginning of the desired camping period or they will be returned.
- 4. A campsite may be reserved for a maximum of 14 nights. Reservations for Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, and Columbus Day will require a 3 NIGHT MINIMUM stay.
- 5. Confirmed reservations will be held until 3:00PM of the day following the first nights reservation. If the person is not present by that time the entire reservation is canceled.
- 6. If a campsite # is not requested on the application, a site will be assigned by the park office. The park reserves the right to make adjustments in the assignment of sites as necessary.
- 7. Confirmed reservations and reservation fees may not be transferred to another person.
- 8. Individuals must be 18 years old or older to reserve a campsite.
- 9. Alcoholic beverages are not permitted in the campgrounds.
