

138. "The Rose in the Mountain." John M. Salyer, Salyersville, Magoffin County, Kentucky, 1941 or 1942. Home recording by Glen and Grover Salyer. Disc 35B. AC003, vol. 2. Fiddle tuned ADae. This tune may once have been a march, but Salyer plays it as fast as a breakdown. It is not to be confused with "Wild Rose of the Mountain," a tune recorded by Kentucky fiddler J.P. Fraley. Its existence in Clyde Davenport's repertoire (see below) is uncharacteristic, and Davenport does not recall where he learned it. It is possible that his source was Bruce Greene.
