CONCERT NEWS

Ready to get into the Christmas spirit? We have a special Christmas show planned, featuring THE MORE THE MERRIER. The date is Saturday, December 12th, the place is SOKOL HALL, 3907 Prairie, Brookfield. Parking is avialable at SOKOL HALL, and the funeral home next door.

Two of the members of the group are Phil Cooper and Margaret Nelson, who've been friends of Plank Road since its inception. You may have seen them perform at any number of places in the area, including the Old Quarter and the Fox Valley Folk Festival. You might have heard the melodious hammer dulcimer of Paul Goelz, as he often joins Phil and Margaret on stage.

Other members of the group include Fred Campeau, Chirps Smith (members of the Volo Bog Trotters) and Michelle Thomas, who often sings in light operas and musicals.

By attending this special Christmas concert, you will hear the banjo, fiddle, guitar, hammered dulcimer, piano, and various percussion instruments combined with vocals to create a fine blend of traditional British Isles, old-timey American, Winter Solstice, and Christmas music. Admission rates are: Adult Members \$5, Students \$4, Adult General Public \$7, and Children under 12 FREE. We'll hope you'll join us for an evening of holiday cheer.

Our Christmas Concert is only one of the special concerts Plank Road is hosting during the 1987-1988 season. THE MORE-THE-MERRIER, December 12, 1987: Featuring: Margaret Nelson, Phil Cooper, Paul Goetz, Mitch Thomas, Chirp Smith, and Fred Campeau. The More-the-Merrier brings their fine repertoire of traditional songs of the US and the British Isles to Brookfield. This concert will include a special Christmas flavor.

ART THIEME, December 19, 1987: Folk singer, story teller, King of the nine string guitar. Art is one of the best children's performers around. He includes a good amount of folk humor and tall tales in his concerts and introduces his audiences to exotic and sometimes strange homemade instruments.

CATHY BARTON and DAVE PARA, January 9, 1988: Cathy and Dave are one of the most popular and well-travelled folk acts to emerge from the Missouri and Ozark region. Instrumental excellence, unique vocal harmonies and a special affection for traditional music are their trademarks. Their more than 10 years of playing together has taken them to festivals, concerts, clubs and schools all over the US. They have also made three tours of Europe. Opening for Cathy and Dave will be Ron Simpson and Roscoe Champ, local favorites who play old time music. Don't miss!

OPEN MIKE, January 23, 1988: Everyone is welcome to play thier favorite instrument, sing songs, or tell stories, at Plank Road's open mike. The evening will begin with a short concert by the Plank Road String Band to kick off the open mike. Members of the string band are: Len Clark, Mary Gabriel, Dawn Guenther, Rich Geiger, Bob Becker. This entertaining group will feature oltime and bluegrass songs with guitar, banjo, mandolin, fiddle, hammer dulcimer, autoharp, bass, jug and more! The string band is composed of members of the Plank Road Folk Music Society.

JIM BREWER with Mark Dvorak, February 6, 1988: Recording Artist from Chicago, Jim Brewer brings an evening of Delta and Country Blues to Brookfield. One of the best blues artists around, Jim plays guitar, autoharp and piano. Opening for Jim Brewer will be another Northern Illinois favorite, Mark Dvorak. Mark plays a variety of traditional and contemporary folk music, using guitar, banjo and the audience.
