Doug & Bonnie Issacson-Miller & Shinobu Sato

Doug & Bonnie Issacson-Miller perform old-time songs with rare Rock solid vocal harmonies and delightful guitar, authenticity. banjo, and autoharp accompaniments. Traditional songs and songs from groups like the Carter Family, gospel songs and traditional music of Illinois that they have collected from the central and southern parts of the state. Doug is the director of the Libertyville School of Folk and Old Time Music.

Sharing the bill with Doug & Bonnie: Shinobou will be performing songs from his recently released album "Red Dragonfly." sophisticated fingerpicking and rich warm arrangements of a wide variety of tunes will make this a night to remember. The tunes range from traditional Irish pieces to folk, ragtime, classical, and traditional Japanese tunes. Folk Traditions -- Doug & Bonnie Issacson-Miller

Folk music, Doug Miller says, is an approach to playing music, a process, a way of doing things which includes an understanding of folk traditions. He and his wife, Bonnie Issacson-Miller, will be performing at Sokol Hall on January 13. They have been playing music together for fifteen years, and they have tried to instill a sense of tradition in all of their performances.

Both Doug and Bonnie started playing instruments at the age of 9 or 10, and became especially interested in folk music during the revival of it in the sixties. Since then they have dedicated much of their time to performing, researching, and presenting folk and old time music. Doug sites his family background as part of the reason for his love of this kind of music. His grandfather, like Doug, was a fiddler, and also performed in a shape-note singing quartet around the turn of the century. Bonnie, too, has memories of music that her grandparents played.

The duo's harmony singing is one of the highlights of their concerts, however, they are both talented instrumentalists, performing with the guitar, banjo, autoharp, and fiddle. The majority of the songs in their repertoire

are over 50 years old, and they try to share some of the history behind them with their audiences. They also perform original songs, written by Doug, which deal with the details and experiences of small town and farming life and which Doug tries to instill with an old-time feel. One of his songs, Fertile Ground, was recorded by Midwest performer Lee Murdock, also a Plank Road favorite.

The Issacson-Millers perform most often at historical societies and museums, places where they can share some of the country's heritage along with their music. In 1984 the Illinois Tourist Bureau sent them to the World's Fair in New Orleans, where they presented a program of folk music in Illinois. The element of regionalism is an important one to Doug, who says that originally folk music was handed down within a community, and musicians performed material drawn from their specific geographic region. Today, however, with the wide-spread availability of information on all cultures and the relative ease of travel, musicians and performers can draw from many communities, bringing together songs from all over the world.

While folk music is no longer restricted to a

certain area for each performer, Doug and Bonnie both feel that a musician must keep a sense of each song's background, must understand the spirit of the music and the way of life it comes from, not just learn the notes and sing the words, but believe in them.


In addition to playing music, Doug is the director of the Libertyville School of Folk and Old Time Music, which he and Bonnie started fifteen The school is years ago. dedicated to presenting and perpetuating music, and presents concerts, barn dances, and open stages, and is part of the David Adler Cultural Center, which also exhibits visual arts and fine arts. As part of his position as director Doug also does field work and documentation, collecting songs from different ethnic communities and presenting musicians from ethnic traditions in an attempt to enrich the folk music community. His efforts toward this end also extend to the Illinois Folk Music Conference, which he has organized and run for the past several years.

The conference, held at the Dixon Mounds, brings together musicians and presenters of folk music for a two-day gathering where they can pool information and share songs. Its goals are to recognize Illinois traditions in music and to share experiences, so

that folk communities can learn from each other's successes and mistakes, and discuss ways of supporting folk music and presenting it to the public.

Doug and Bonnie live in Spring Grove, Illinois, about 20 miles from the Libertyville school, and have three children ages 5, 7, and 10.


