PICKY, PICKY, PICKIN'

Pickin'. A significant word with many meanings. It means plucking, and pulling, fingering and choosing. It also means abusing. Folk musicians use it as a common word. Slaves also used it as a common word. Of course, in the the mesh of these meanings there is a harmony.

It is this very harmony that may be disturbed in one version of the folk lullaby "All the Pretty Little Horses." Tradition has it that the song was sung by a black woman lullabying her masters child while her own babe lie unattended. The version that has the "birds" and "butterflies" that "flutter about" the eyes of a poor baby cryin' "mama," may be more aesthetic than the version that has "bees" and butterflies "pickin'" on the eyes of a poor littly thing cryin' "Mammy," but it hits some discord, because the pain has been picked out. Birds flutter in joy. Bees sting like cotton when it's picked from the shrub.

Picky as all this may seem, one of the strengths of folk music is that there are different versions of each song that the singer can pick and choose. Changing, omitting, and adding words is part of the folklore process but it ought to be done carefully so that the images of the root are preserved. I can not think of a word that brings me closer to the image of a slave than the word pickin'. To change this word to conjure a sweet image leaves us out of tune with the past. We lose this meaning and the truth and in doing so, we lose a significant element of the folk tradition.

"Hush-a-by, don't you cry,
Go to sleep-y little baby
When you wake, you shall have
All the pretty little horses
Blacks and bays, dapples and grays
Coach and six-little horses

Down in the meadow, lies a poor little lamb—y
Go to sleep—y little baby
Bees and butterflies, pickin' on its eyes
Poor little thing is cryin' Mammy
Blacks and bays, dapples and grays
Coach and six—little horses


