## February 13th Bluegrass Double Bill to feature Running Fox & The Jones Family at Sokol Hall

The suburbs' top traditional bluegrass artists, Running Fox and The Jones Family will perform in a big Plank Road Folk Music Society bluegrass show on Saturday, February 13 at 8:00 pm at Sokol Hall, 3907 Prairie in Brookfield.

Running Fox Bluegrass has performed extensively over the last decade at major bluegrass festivals and concerts throughout Illinois and the tri-state area. Larry Robinson, who is the host of WDCB's "Strictly Bluegrass" (heard Wednesdays at 3:00 pm, 90.9 fm), is one of the Chicago area's most ardent supporters and promoters of traditional bluegrass music and is the founder and leader of Running Fox.

Their 5 piece ensemble features Robinson on guitar and Dobro along with fiddle, banjo, mandolin and bass fiddle and has appeared most recently for the Warrenville Folk Music Society, and the Joliet Jr. College Multi-Cultural Folk Festival.

The Jones Family will open the concert with a selection of bluegrass and traditional songs, a form of music they have been performing and teaching for more than twenty-five years. Their performances are highlighted by their innovative and beautiful 3-part

vocal arrangements and solid musicianship. Their material is drawn from a variety of sources including gospel, folk and old-time Appalachian, and they play a great multitude of instruments.

Mother Anne plays the guitar and Appalachian dulcimer, and handles most of the lead vocal work while daughter Cathy plays the fiddle, banjo and mandolin. Father Tom is one of the area's expert old-time banjo players and also handles a good part of the lead and harmony vocals.

Admission is \$7 (\$5 for current members) and seating is plentiful. for more information phone 708/387-9312 or 708/964-0305.

# Pure Unsweetened Family Concert features Michael Cooney on March 13th


on March 13th in Downers Grove afternoon show

Michael Cooney's one-man "Pure Unsweetened Family Show" makes a visit to the Two Way Street Coffee House, 1047 Curtiss, Downers Grove on Saturday afternoon, March 13th. Although the exact time has not been confirmed as we go to print, it will be an afternoon program the entire family will sure enjoy.

Cooney is a legend in the folk music world giving many thousands of performances in his 25+ year career. He says, "In one sense, all music is children's music. Kids enjoy many songs which we wouldn't even expect them to understand. Sometimes, as with some children's books which grown-ups love too, they appreciate them on a different level."

Cooney plays a wide variety of instruments including the six string guitar, twelve string guitar, 5 string banjo, fretless banjo, concertina (squeezebox) and various other small instruments (harmonica, jaw harp, kazoo, etc.). He also tells captivating folktales (some complete with instrumental sound effects).

# An Evening with Michael Cooney

Concert set for Saturday, March 13 at Sokol Hall, Brookfield

The Plank Road Folk Music Society proudly presents An Evening with Michael Cooney, on Saturday, March 13, at 8:00 pm at Sokol Hall, 3907 Prairie Avenue in Brookfield.

Michael Cooney is widely recognized for his expertise and for his ability to entertain any type of audience. A legend in the folk music world, his performance, and recording credits and his list of contributions to the field of folk music and folklore are extensive.

He has appeared in countless halls, clubs, coffeehouses throughout the U.S., Canada, Great Britain and Europe and made many media appearances (among them "A Prairie Home Companion," "The Today Show," "Sesame Street," "Captain Kangaroo"). He has performed, lectured or done residencies at hundreds of U.S. and Canadian universities, including Harvard, where he lectured for the Department of Folklore and Mythology. He has performed at all the major North American folk festivals, including The National Folk Festival, Newport, Smithsonian, Mariposa, Winnipeg, Vancouver, San Diego, Hudson River Revival, Monterey and Berkeley. He's been a performer and m/c at the Philadelphia Folk Festival (North America's biggest) for the last 10 years.

Cooney has also served on the board of the National Folk Festival in Washington D.C. and has served as artistic director of Canada's Mariposa Folk Festival and Philadelphia's "Maritime America Festival;" and has served as consultant to many other festivals.

Above all, Michael Cooney sings a marvelous variety of songs--old and new, from far and near--and his repertoire is enormous. He sings authentic American, Afro-American, Canadian, English, Irish and Australian folk songs, old American popular and novelty songs (mostly form the 1920's -1940's), and has an ever-increasing collection of new songs which are funny and thought provoking. He is a captivating storyteller, and he plays a multitude of instruments outstandingly; including six-string guitar, twelve string guitar, five string banjo, fretless banjo, concertina ("squeezebox") and various small instruments (harmonica, kazoo, jaw-harp, etc.).

What Michael Cooney does best, is to look at an audience and choose the right songs. Songs that will communicate to them (no matter what their musical preferences) the value (and fun) of music. He demonstrates what real folk music is, its place in our musical heritage, and it's value to us today.

The <u>Chicago Sun-Times</u> says, "Michael Cooney is so rare and special that every time you see him, it's like the first time you had ice cream. It's a discovery, something new and marvelous that you'll never forget... He'll do whatever is necessary to turn the dustiest, most obscure old relic into something that's **absorbing entertainment**....he can't help impressing happy audiences that he is close to being the complete entertainer."
