## HERITAGE FESTIVAL FOLK STAGE CELEBRATES 14 YEARS!

The entertaining sound of banjos, guitars, fiddles, mandolins and dulcimers will draw "fest-goers" to Fishel Park in Downers Grove on Saturday, June 28 for the 14<sup>th</sup> Annual Heritage Festival Folk Stage. Always popular, it's a chance to retreat for a time from the bustle of the street fair to the trees and lawn of the park for some great music.

A special treat this year will be the appearance of the *District 99 Sinfonia*, a select group of string students from Downers Grove North and South High Schools who will perform with virtuoso banjo artist *Michael Miles*. They teamed up twice earlier this year for concerts presenting both traditional American folk and classical music to enthusiastic audiences.

Internationally acclaimed guitarist *Muriel Anderson* also makes her debut on the Folk Stage this year. Music of this Downers Grove native has even been heard on NASA's space shuttle!

Many other acoustic musicians and songwriters will appear all day. They include *The Jones Family, Jim Wearne, Patti Ecker, Live Bait, Andrew Calhoun, Kevin Mulvenna, Diane Ippel, Darwin & Marv* and *Small Potatoes.* [See schedule to the right.] The Folk Stage is hosted by the Two Way Street Coffee House, which has been presenting weekly shows in downtown Downers Grove for almost 27 years.

Other festival events hosted this weekend by the Two Way Street include the Tom and Steve Chapin concert on Friday night, June 27; the great Canadian group Tamarack on Saturday following the Folk Stage, and the Family Barn Dance on Sunday Afternoon, June 29. There will also be appearances by Kathy O'Hara and Diana Laffey, the Chenille Sisters and the Mamas and the Papas. (More Heritage Festival info inside!)

Festival season is upon us again, and its time to prepare for the flood of opportunities for lamming, workshops, concerts, and other opportunities for sharing our love of music with others!

Presenting these opportunities is a gargantuan undertaking, and would not be possible without the help of volunteers! Everyone out there is capable of helping out in some way. Won't you consider giving some time this summer to help out the festival(s) that have helped introduce you to and keep you going in your folk/traditional music journey? Here are a few opportunities in which you can help out Plank Road this summer:

#### PLANK ROAD AT HERITAGE FESTIVAL, JUNE 27, 28 &29:

- We need people to help man the information tables at the various events. This basically involves handing out flyers to people who want to know more about the folk scene in the Western Suburbs. It is a great way to get to greet people and share your love for this music! The Folk Stage table and Tamarack table on Saturday will also involve tape & CD etc. sales for the performers. No experience is necessary. (There will be a coordinator that will show you the ropes and answer more complicated questions!) If you are interested, call Cathy at 630/889-9121.
- We could use some extra hands in setting up the folk stage on Saturday morning. Again, there is a "straw boss" who will be guiding
  the setup, so no special experience is necessary—except to be prepared for some heavy work! For more information, call Tim Kendall at

- For the Sunday Barn Dance this year, we would like to try something new. We are looking for eight volunteers who would be willing to be
  a core group of dancers to encourage others to join in. No experience is necessary, for Marianne will teach all the steps. In this case,
  maybe less is more—we really do want to show that anyone can join in, so we are not looking for professional dancers—just people with

#### PLANK ROAD AT THE WARRENVILLE FOLK FESTIVAL, JULY 12 & 13:

• Plank Road is forming a Bocce Ball team for the Bocce Ball Tournament at the Warrenville Folk Festival. In true Plank Road form, no experience is necessary. (Last year's team was made up of innocent bystanders who had never played the game before—they had loads of fun!) So anyone who wants to learn more about Bocce Ball is welcome to join up. We need at least four people to make up a team. We already have two people—one of whom actually knows how to play! If we get more than four people, we can have alternates. We will probably try to get together sometime before July 12&13 to run through the rules, actually see a Bocce Ball set and maybe get a few pointers on how to play. Basically, Bocce Ball is something like lawn bowling, I think. It is not an overly strenuous sport, and anyone can play. The Maple Street Chapel Team is the current reigning champs from the last two years—primarily because they have had very little competition in the tournament. Congratulations to Jim Wearne, who has just released his second cassette featuring the music of Cornwall! The Suburban LIFE included a very nice article on Jim Wearne, so here it is for those of you who didn't see it:

Downers Grove Cornish-American folksinger Jim Wearne has released his second collection of songs from Cornwall titled "Heroes, Lovers and Ducks." The cassette features Wearne as vocalist, with accompanying instruments ranging from a brass ensemble with military percussion to banjo and crowdy crawn (a Cornish drum). A chorus of friends supplies the pub atmosphere on the singalongs.

"The title refers to themes of some of the songs, and reflects their sometimes whimsical nature," Wearne commented.

Cornwall, occupying the far southwestern tip of Britain, is one of the ancient Celtic kingdoms. It has its own Celtic language and culture, its own food (the Cornish pasty and more) and a variety of styles of music ranging from folksongs and jigs to formal choirs and bands.

Wearne's live recordings from the Oatlands Celtic Festival are in the Library of Congress. His previous release "Hot Pasties—Cold Comfort" has enjoyed air play as far afield as Australia. Other broadcast credits include BBC Radio Cornwall, WFMT-FM's "Midnight Special" and the Studs Turkel program. (the Suburban LIFE, May 21, 1997) Look for Jim Wearne at Heritage Festival's Folk Stage, and in the workshop area at Warrenville Folk Festival.

Here's some news we received over the e-mail regarding our good friend Art Theime:

Illinois folksinger Art Theime is currently recovering from surgery—a knee replacement, complicated by a bleeding ulcer. Although he is making good progress, it will be a while before he can do any performing at all, and much longer before he can resume a fully active schedule. His medical bills are covered by insurance, but he has virtually no income to cover his family's living expenses (including that health insurance) during the period he isn't working. (Art has suffered through other major surgeries over the last decade, and he hasn't toured or recorded at the same level as many other musicians, so he doesn't have a lot of savings.)

Cathy Fink is collecting financial donations to help him get through the next few months. Even small donations are welcome; if everyone who has enjoyed Art's music each contributed \$10 or \$20, collectively we could really help him out. And of course we welcome larger donations if you can afford to do more. Cathy will forward all money received directly to Art, and she'll list the names and addresses of the donors (but not the amounts) unless anyone chooses to stay anonymous.






