An Evening of Irish Music with Baal Tinne, to support the Academy of Irish Music!

The Plank Road Folk Music Society and the Two Way Street Coffee House are pleased to announce Chicago's dynamic Irish music band Baal Tinne in Concert at the Two Way Street Coffee House in Downers Grove on April 12, 2003 at 8:00 pm. Admission is \$12 for General Admission, \$10 for Plank Road members. This concert will benefit the Academy of Irish Music, and will include performances by the student groups of the Academy of Irish Music.

The Academy of Irish Music, a not-for-profit organization, consists of students from throughout the Chicago Metropolitan area that are interested in playing and sharing Irish traditional music. The focus of the Academy is on making Irish traditional music a part of the student's education, and something they will have and enjoy for the rest of their lives, by developing young musicians from grade school through late teens using traditional, conservatory and Suzuki instruction techniques. Under the direction of well-known Chicago musician Noel Rice, students join the beginner, intermediate or senior groups depending upon ability, experience and instrumental needs. The Academy also makes available private lessons on a variety of instruments including whistle, fiddle, bodhran, and harp.

The evening will feature the music of internationally acclaimed group Baal Tinne (pronounced "Bahl Tinnuh"). Baal Tinne is a 5 member Irish Music Group based in Chicago and founded in the early 80s by flute player Noel Rice. The band now consists of five members: Noel on flute and tin whistle, his daughter Cathleen on fiddle, his son Kevin on bodhran (Irish drum), Matt Sundstrom on guitar and Richard Roche on piano and keyboards. Noel and Richard were born and raised in Ireland. Baal Tinne combines Irish traditional music with backgrounds in classical and jazz music. "The tunes we perform are orchestrated and arranged to bring Irish music into the realm of listening music, without loosing the tradition – that comfortable, familiar sound of Celtic music," says leader Noel Rice. "And indeed, you can still dance to it."

The students of the Academy compete individually and as a group at the Midwest Fleadh Cheoil. This is the qualifying competition for the All-Ireland music competition held each year in late August. Funds raised at this concert will help defray costly travel expenses and allow these young people to participate in this valuable experience. Make plans to join us for this special evening, and help us support these young people and their music!

Larry Penn CD Release Concert!

The Plank Road Folk Music Society and the Two Way Street Coffee House are pleased to present Larry Penn CD Release Concert at the Two Way Street Coffee House in Downers Grove on May 10, 2003 at 8:00 pm. Admission is \$12 for General Admission, \$10 for Plank Road members. Larry and special guests Mark Dvorak and Marianne Mohrhusen will play tunes from Larry's newest CD "A Ride on the Westbound", as well as many of the other Larry Penn songs we know and love.

Larry Penn is a skillful songwriter with an acute sense of imagery. His songs are elegant in their simplicity. This gravely voiced folk singer and songwriter can claim work that has been recorded by at least thirty other performers, including Peter Seeger, John McCutcheon

and Claudia Schmidt. He is a three-decade veteran performer who has played a range of venues that has taken him from hobo camp fires to the Fiat Motor Company's 1990 Musica E. Lovoro in Torino, Italy. From a song bag mixed with collected tradition, Larry Penn sings and tells stories of hard work, working people, trains, trucks, life on the road, love and pink flamingos! His style is deceptively sparse and his appearance unassuming, but the power of imagery and depth of insight is clear. The listener is taken by surprise!

"For 90 minutes he captivated his listeners with stories and songs about Hoboes and railroad graffiti. The subjects of his songs are as wide ranging as the audience he sings for. Children and adults laugh at the ones about pink flamingos, and pictures on freight cars..." writes the St. Cloud Times of Minnesota. "Most are songs that touch the human heart or the funny bone. They are toe tapping melodies, often with sing along chorus' that linger long after the singer has put his guitar away" says The Alphena News of Michigan.

We are thrilled to have our good friend Larry Penn, with Mark Dvorak and Marianne Mohrhusen, back to celebrate this special occasion. Larry Penn's latest CD "A Ride On the Westbound" (on which Mark Dvorak and Marianne Mohrhusen accompany Larry) features railroad songs, from old familiars like Danville Girl, Little Stream of Whiskey and John Henry, to songs written in the inimitable style of Larry Penn, each with their own story behind them. The title song, A Ride on the Westbound (Lord Open Road), reflects hobo life and reflects on a hobo named Lord Open Road who "had something eloquent to expound on most any given subject". Down By the Maco Station is based on a ghostly tale of a railroad worker who met with a deadly accident. There are a few non-railroad songs, such as Watchin Lake Michigan Roll, about a lighthouse keeper, and The Bannockburn about a steam powered three-masted package freighter that disappeared on Lake Superior and Potato Man about a potato farmer. Copies of the CD will be available for sale. Join us for this special evening and get your copy of A Ride on the Westbound!

House Concert with Michael McNevin

Sunday, April 27, at 2:30PM, Plank Road Folk Music Society Members Denise Davis and Jim Wilson will be hosting a house concert for California singer/songwriter Michael McNevin. Michael has won a succession of songwriting awards including the Kerrville, Napa Valley, and Columbia River New-Folk Competitions.

Michael has been described as a tireless traveler and troubadour who has played the stages of clubs and festivals all over the United Stated. His shows are full of stories from the road, highlighting a melodic, seasoned voice, intricate guitar work, and a down-to-earth sense of humor. Michael is also an Etch a Sketch Artist.

"I don't know what's best about this CD [Sketch] - Michael McNevin's music or his Etch A Sketch drawings that accompany each song. McNevin is a singer-songwriter of the highest order...His sense of humor and eye for meaningful moments in the lives of his fellow townsfolk and travelers make him the kind of artist that listeners appreciate for both the language and the passion he brings to his music."
